Friedrichstadt-Palast Berlin is back from the summer break with THE WYLD. Aliens from the Grand Show have returned to Earth too. After landing on the Teufelsberg, they jumped on the U-Bahn to arrive at the Palast stage ready for the first performance on 6 August.

Freshly rested and full of energy, the Friedrichstadt-Palast ensemble is currently making its way back to the German capital from all corners of the globe. Of course, the show's very own aliens had a bit further to travel: their spaceship landed at the former U.S. military and NSA listening station on the Teufelsberg.

General manager Shalmon Abraham was clearly impressed by the extraterrestrial visit: 'This historic location has seen a lot over the years. It was home to a military school, became a rubble mountain, and during the Cold War it was an American listening station. No wonder these glamorous aliens chose this exciting landing site.'

As they made their 12-kilometre journey to work by bus and U-Bahn from the Teufelsberg in the Grunewald forest to the East End Theatre District in Berlin-Mitte, the galactic beings were a spectacular sight even for hard-nosed Berliners and well-travelled tourists.
